Dr. Joseph M. Giovannetti created this fund to honor his mother Mercedes (Whipple) Giovannetti, a Tolowa Tribal elder who passed away at age 65 in 1991. The fund assists elders of the Smith River Rancheria with medical prescriptions, energy assistance, transportation, and food vouchers.

WHAT HAPPENED IN OCTOBER?

- HAF staff celebrated along with our community as the City of Eureka officially returned Duluwat Island to the Wiyot people on Monday, October 21.
- Members of HAF's Social Justice Donor Circle held a "Meet Your Neighbor" dinner and mixer at the Potawot Health Center. The relationship-building event brought together Native nonprofit leaders and non-Native potential donors.
- Kathleen Kelly Janus, Senior Advisor on Social Innovation to Governor Gavin Newsom, visited the region as part of a state-wide listening campaign. HAF helped connect her with representatives from 50 organizations, including Native-led nonprofits, health, environmental, arts and many other sectors.
- Never Again is Now, a project by HumAsians & Friends, received a \$2,000 Grassroots Grant for a display about Japanese internment camps during Fred Korematsu Day in February.
- The Cultural Fire Management Council received a \$9,460 Community grant to help pay fire personnel during traditional burns on Yurok land.
- The Curry Child Abuse Intervention Center (aka Wally's House) received a \$12,149 Community Grant for recording equipment essential to the work of documenting victim and witness statements.
