



## The Roelofs Humboldt Fisheries Fund

*“Supporting the next generation of fisheries biologists and conservationists”*

In 2002 a group of Humboldt Fisheries alumni formed the *Humboldt Fishin' Lumberjacks* to share quality time ‘on the water’ fishing together and reflecting on our shared life experiences. During our time at Humboldt State University (HSU), we had all benefitted directly from and been inspired by **Dr. Terry Roelofs**, longtime Fisheries department leader and current Professor Emeritus of Fisheries Biology at HSU.

Dr. Roelofs began his Humboldt career in 1970, guiding and building the department into the internationally recognized center of fisheries excellence that we proudly identify with and support. Terry has served as professor, mentor, fly fishing guru, and inspiration to decades of fisheries students, many of whom have used their Humboldt experience as a springboard to long and successful careers in fisheries science and management.

We felt it was fitting to honor Terry’s legacy by creating the ***Roelofs Humboldt Fisheries Fund*** to pay his vision forward to help support HSU students with financial needs who are seeking a post-graduate degree in Fisheries or a related field. Since 2015 we have provided monetary grants to students actively engaged in graduate studies, recognizing the difficulty that older students—often with a family to support—have in achieving this goal. The monetary awards focus on applicants with an interest in fisheries conservation and enhancement research that applies to or directly benefits North Coast watersheds and adjacent marine waters. To date, the *Humboldt Fishin' Lumberjacks* have raised more than \$100,000 to support the Roelofs Fund, mostly from our own pockets.

We are now launching a fund-raising campaign to help increase the size of the fund so that we can offer additional and more substantial annual awards to deserving students. The fund is managed by the Humboldt Area Foundation, and it’s easy to contribute online or by check.
